Selection Process

These resources were selected in line with principles set by the ISBE Culturally Responsive Teaching and Leading Standards and recommendations laid out in the Framework for School & School System Leaders (The Leadership Academy, 2022). Selection was limited to resources that provided a foundation for cultural diversity or those that sought to promote academic success, culturally responsive leadership, and/or critical leadership consciousness as consistent with the earlier aims. Resources on the foundations of cultural diversity were aimed at introducing and extending new and advanced leaders with respect to basic dimensions of the topic. Academic success was a criteria to ensure that resources centered minoritized student achievement and promoted practices that linked diversity and high student expectations. Sensitive to the unique role played by school leaders, leadership tools specifically addressing discipline, shaping academic environments, communication, achievement, and parent and community involvement were included. Critical leadership consciousness tools complimented the data (Minkos et al., 2017) showing that embedding culturally responsive leadership is done best when leaders are capable of identify, question, and critique social conventions and systems targeting vulnerable communities. These resources work to shape leaders who are self-reflexive, proactive, skilled, courageous, fair, culturally competent leaders. Selection Process

These resources were selected in accordance with principles set by the ISBE Culturally Responsive Teaching and Leading Standards and with the knowledge that teachers have many responsibilities and may not have additional time to look for credible resources. The resources listed can be used either as additional learning opportunities or as materials in the classroom. Sections pertaining to curriculum, education books, and podcasts are for teachers to explore ways to learn about systems of oppression that operate in education and how their own positionalities might be implicated or serve as a strength. These resources also offer teachers potential networks to collaborate with other teachers and leaders in education. The books for students were selected in line with Dr. Marlee Bunch's UN/HUSH framework and Dr. Sarah Park Dahlen's criteria for AAPI literature. These books are vetted choices to either incorporate in curriculum or offer in the classroom for independent reading. 
